Seamus Murphy is the Director of Government and Community Affairs for SamTrans, CalTrain and the San Mateo County Transportation Authority. Murphy's primary responsibility is legislative advocacy on behalf of the three local agencies he serves, but he has become a key player on the California Transit Association Executive and Legislative Committees and a crucial strategist in the efforts of the San Francisco region and the state to go forward with plans to build a statewide high-speed rail network that has as its centerpiece the CalTrain right-of-way. During his tenure, he led successful efforts to secure legislative approval for CalTrain Modernization funding as one of the early investment projects funded through the High Speed Rail Authority budget and he has directed strategic communications around the agencies' federal and statewide legislative efforts.



John Ford has been Executive Director of Commute.org since 2012. Prior to joining Commute.org, he worked for ten years in the non-profit sector. John also spent nearly two decades in the software industry where he managed Business Strategy and Finance for an international software development and consulting company. John received his BA in Economics from U.C. Davis and his MBA from Pepperdine University. He has been racing sailboats on San Francisco Bay for over 40 years and referees youth soccer games throughout the Bay Area.



Matt Goyne is a transportation engineer with 10 years' experience conducting studies throughout Foster City. During this time, Matt has led citywide studies of traffic, bicycle, and walking conditions and helped Foster City understand the impacts of major employers or infrastructure projects on the transportation network. Through his role in leading Fehr & Peers' San Francisco office, Matt helps communities from Redwood City to Sonoma County address their most pressing transportation challenges. Matt is also currently involved in research efforts that explore how disruptive technologies and demographic changes will affect transportation planning decisions in the future. Matt is a registered professional engineer with a degree in Civil Engineering from Cal Poly San Luis Obispo.
