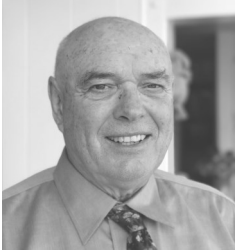

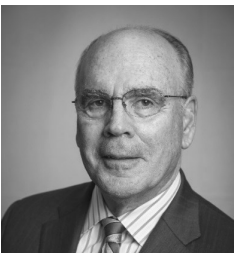
Rick Williams, Van Meter Williams Pollack LLP, is a founding partner with Van Meter Williams Pollack, working in Urban Design and Affordable Housing for 30 years in the San Francisco Bay Area. Rick's focus includes working on affordable housing and market rate developments, as well as, working with Cities and communities planning for transit oriented, mixed use and high density infill housing.



Bruce Dorfman, Thompson Dorfman LLC, currently serves as Senior Managing Director of the Northern California Division of Trammell Crow Residential. Bruce is also a founder of Education Housing Partners, a California public benefit corporation focused on advising school districts on the development of teacher housing projects. He has developed over 15,000 multi-family units providing both market-rate and affordable housing and brings extensive knowledge of the challenges and opportunities in providing workforce housing options for school districts.



Andrea Osgood, Eden Housing, joined the Eden Housing Development team in 2008 and currently leads Eden's new construction and acquisition efforts as Director of Real Estate Development. Since joining Eden, Ms. Osgood has developed over 300 new units and overseen the acquisition of nearly 800 existing units in six California counties. Ms. Osgood is on the Board of Directors of the Housing Leadership Council of San Mateo County and is an inaugural member of the Board of Directors of SV@Home, a newly formed affordable housing advocacy organization in Santa Clara County.



Don Horsley, San Mateo County Third District Board Supervisor, is a former police officer who went on to become the elected San Mateo County Sheriff. Supervisor Horsley has focused his attention on transportation, affordable housing, migrant farm labor, agricultural issues and health care during his first six years in office. Supervisor Horsley was instrumental in convening the Closing the Jobs/Housing Gap Task Force and co-chairs the Home for All Initiative. In addition, he is chair of the Housing Endowment and Regional Trust (HEART) Board.
